POLICY:

The Lapeer County Community Mental Health (LCCMH) employs prescribers as regular staff and/or independent contractors to provide medically necessary medical services and supports.

STANDARDS:

- A. A medical director is designated to provide medical oversight for other prescribers, direction for the medical services, and participate in quality of care and management-related committees as required. The medical director is a psychiatrist designated by and reports to the Chief Executive Officer.
- B. Prescribers are appropriately licensed and credentialed to provide medically necessary services identified in the Individual Plans of Service (IPOS) of the persons served.

PROCEDURES:

- A. Specific responsibilities of the medical director include:
 - 1. Clinical oversight and direction for LCCMH's prescribers.

- 2. Provision of emergency consultation to LCCMH's after-hours clinical staff, as needed
- 3. Participation in quality of care and management related committees, including Quality Council, Behavior Treatment Plan Review Committee, and Medical Department meetings, as required.
- 4. Review of LCCMH policies and procedures requiring physician input and approval.
- 5. Liaison services to the Region 10 PIHP's medical staff and the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, as required.
- 6. Participation in clinical staff education activities, as required.
- B. Specific responsibilities of the prescribers include:
 - 1. Provision of psychiatric evaluations.
 - 2. Provision of medication evaluations, prescriptions, and reviews.
 - 3. Review IPOS for persons served prescribed medications in the Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) program, as assigned.
 - 4. Consultation with clinical staff.
 - 5. Review of physical health and medical conditions of persons served, including review and authorization of lab work, as necessary.
 - 6. Referrals and consultation with primary care physicians of persons served, as necessary.
 - 7. Coordination and monitoring for persons served receiving court mandated services, as assigned.

DEFINITIONS:

<u>Prescriber:</u> a physician, nurse practitioner, or physician's assistant licensed by the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulation to prescribe medication.
