


CCBHC Grant Update


In September 2022, Lapeer County Community Mental Health (LCCMH) was awarded a four-year Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) Planning, Development, and Implementation Grant through the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). The purpose of a CCBHC is to ensure access to coordinated, comprehensive behavioral health care by prioritizing evidence-based services, quick access to treatment, and care coordination of behavioral health care, physical health care, social services, and other community resources.

2025 Clinical Quality Measures

Both state and clinic-level quality measures are components of improving care and measuring outcomes in CCBHCs. These measures aim to ensure standards of care and identify outcomes and effective use of services. In 2024, technical specifications were released to guide preparation for reporting, with the first quarter of FY 2025 serving as a test period. These measures are vital for improving patient care and outcomes across services. Below is a brief list of examples of clinical quality measures being tracked at both the clinic and state levels:

Clinic- or CMH-Reported

- Screening for Clinical Depression and Follow-Up
- Time to Services
- Preventative Care and Screening: Unhealthy Alcohol Use
- Screening for Social Drivers of Health

State-Reported

- Patient Experience of Care Survey
- Adherence to Antipsychotic Medications
- Follow-Up After ED Visit/Hospitalization for Mental Health and Substance Use
- Antidepressant Medication Management

Outcomes and Performance



As part of the CCBHC grant, LCCMH is tracking performance on several SAMHSA-required measures, including:

- Infrastructure, Development, Prevention, and Mental Health Promotion (IPP) indicators
- Clinical Quality Measures
- Program Goals and Objectives
- National Outcome Measures (NOMs)

This quarter, we are highlighting performance and outcomes from the NOMs.


National Outcome Measures

34 individuals have completed both a baseline and reassessment interview.



*For example, 5.9% less individuals had no crime involvement at reassessment than at baseline. Conversely, 66.7% more individuals were socially connected at reassessment than at baseline.
